#### Lateness

I would also like to take this opportunity to mention lateness. Again, most pupils always arrive at school on time and are ready to start their lessons at 8.55am. Of course we understand that , occasionally, things happen that are unavoidable . This message is for the handful of pupils that regularly arrive at the last minute and mean that classes are unsettled at the start of the day. It is surprisingly disruptive when a child is late into class, particularly younger pupils who find it more difficult to sort themselves out and need additional support to get organised. This inevitably means the teaching assistants are then distracted from the work they are supposed to be doing at that time.
