Breakfast and After School Club


We are not quite back to full capacity for Breakfast and After School Club, and are unfortunately unable to accept occasional bookings before the summer break.

Wagtails


Wagtails class were very busy last term learning about volcanoes. We enjoyed making different types and shapes of volcanoes, using playdough as well as mud. Sweets, honey, washing up liquid and marmalade really helped us understand how lava is not always the same. In the outdoor area, we were able to build and erupt our own volcanoes, which was fantastic! With our hard work, we were able to explain how and why volcanoes erupt using actions





and a written explanation.

After volcanoes, we moved onto learning about how the movement of tectonic plates cause earthquakes (with the help of marmalade and rice crackers). It was interesting to know how they start beneath the surface and how we measure them. If you ask any of us about how to stay safe in an earthquake, we can explain it in good detail.

Governors Update by Amy Mason

I joined the Governors in 2018 and currently have 2 children attending Hope Brook. The role of the Governors is really important and our job is to be a critical friend asking questions and to help make decisions to improve the children's education.

This term there have been 2 Governor's meetings one of the resources committee, which covers finance, staffing and premises, and a full Governors meeting.

We covered many different topics during our Full Governors Meeting ranging from the school website, Feedback from the resources committee and an Ofsted Update.

We discussed remote learning during the difficult months of lockdown and as Governors we were so pleased to hear of the good engagement from the children. The school were really happy with the eschools platform and how it allowed more interaction between children and teachers. As Governors we also discussed the current assessments of our children at Hope Brook and how lockdown has affected their learning. The school and staff have looked closely at how the curriculum is now tailored to take account of missed learning.

The school has been looking at new Interactive Whiteboards for some time and in previous Governors meetings we had agreed that this was a purchase that needed to be made to aid the children's learning. Feedback from the staff and children has been extremely positive!
