Who should I talk to if I would like to discuss my child's progress?



We operate an Open Door Policy, parents and carers are always welcome to discuss matters as they arise.

How is my child's progress monitored?

Children are assessed by their class teachers and teaching assistants in a variety of ways. These include:

- Continual Classroom Observations (Daily)
- Summative Assessments (Weekly/Termly)
- Formative Assessments (Termly/Yearly)
- My Plan or My Plan+
- Education Health and Care Plans



What support might my child be offered, to ensure they achieve their potential?

All those involved with a child meet to discuss the individual's needs to decide the most effective resources or programme of work to address the child's area(s) of need.

School offers a variety of support strategies:

- Small group in class support
- Small group withdrawal support
- Individualised programmes or strategies
- One to One Tuition with a teacher or TA

Support is allocated according to the needs and resources available.


