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Dear Parents, Governors, Staff & Friends,

After School Club—Price increases

We are currently reviewing our pricing of Breakfast Club and After School Club. As you will be aware the charge for this service has not changed for five years. Unfortunately, we find ourselves in a position that means this is unsustainable. The charges for this service will need to increase. Initially, we are making two price increases. ASC charge for 3.15pm—4pm will increase to £3.50. The charge for Breakfast Club will also increase to £3.50. Further increases are likely to be necessary from the start of the next financial year—April 2020.

School Dinners

From Monday 6 January, we would like to introduce a new system for booking lunches. We will be utilising the booking system on Parentpay for meal choices. We hope that you will find this a much more convenient system as you will be able to check you have ordered meals for your children from your phone and you won't have to remember to fill in the paper slips any longer. Illness

Following a number of incidents of sickness at school, we felt it might be helpful to provide a reminder about the Government's guidance for schools.

Children and adults with diarrhoea or vomiting should be excluded until 48 hours after symptoms have stopped and they are well enough to return. If medication is prescribed, ensure that the full course is completed and there is no further diarrhoea or vomiting for 48 hours after the course is completed.

Please note the guidance states children should not return until 48 hours after symptoms have stopped—so 48hours after the last episode of sickness. Further information can be found at the link above or on the NHS website.
