### Classes for next year

### End of KS1 Assessments

It will be a busy week for Y2 next week as this is the week we aim to complete our assessments of the children's KS1 experience at Hope Brook. We aim to ensure that children feel comfortable when undertaking these assessments and know they will try to do their very best.

# Multiplication Tables Check

By the end of next week, all of the Y4 children will have had a go at completing the Government's 25 question, on-line check which aims to track whether Y4 children have achieved the Government expectation of knowing their 2 - 12x tables by the end of Y4. We know that the Y4 children have been working really hard to master all of their tables. We will know the outcome of these tests later this term.

## Kingfishers Trip

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> June 2022, Kingfishers will be visiting the American Museum in Bath. The children will be leaving school at 9am and will return to school by 4.00pm approximately. They should wear school uniform for the trip, and they will need a packed lunch and drink in a non-breakable container. As with most school trips, we recommend the children carry their belongings in a back pack for the day. The children will not need any money.

### Leavers Service

On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> June 2022, Y6 will be attending the Leavers Service at Gloucester Cathedral. This is always a lovely opportunity for schools in Gloucester to come together to mark this very important stage in young people's lives. We will be leaving school at 9.30am and will return to school by lunch time. This is always seen as a special occasion so we hope the children will be in their usual smart uniforms so we can make the most of the photo opportunity outside one of Gloucestershire's iconic landmarks - Gloucester Cathedral.

### Brooklets

At 2.00pm on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June 2022, we will be holding our first Brooklets session of the year. This is the time we welcome the children that will be joining Robins in September. I can't believe we have reached that point in the year already. The Brooklets session runs for an hour. The Brooklets children are collected at 3pm, allowing new parents to collect their children before the rest of the school are dismissed.
